Whereas, the town of Mena was on the 12th day of September, 1896, duly and legally incorporated in pursuance of the laws of the State of Ark. by order of the County Judge of Polk County, Arkansas and on the 4th day of November, 1896 an election was held in pursuance of law, at which a Mayor, Recorder and a Board of Five Aldermen were duly elected, perfecting and completing the incorporation of the town of Mena, Arkansas; therefore

Be it Ordained by the Town Council of the Incorporated Town of Mena Arkansas.

Section 1. That all of said streets alleys and thoroughfares and "Stillwell Park" and "Janssen Park" as indicated on the plat above referred to be and the same are hereby accepted by the corporate authorities of the town and shall be known and designated by the name and names given, and assigned them by the said Arkansas Construction Company.

Section 2. It shall be unlawful for any person to drive or ride in or through Stillwell Park or Janssen Park or cut or injure any tree or trees, or haul away or take off any timber from either of said parks; and it shall also be unlawful for any person to hitch, tie or tether any horse, mule, ox, cow, steer, calf or other stock to any tree, stub, stick, fence or other thing, in, around or about either of said parks; any person violating this ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and on conviction fined in any sum not exceeding twenty-five dollars for such offense.

Section 3. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

Ordinance No. 58 ✓

Selling Or Giving Liquor To Indians, Minors or Prisoners.

Be it ordained by the town Council of the Incorporated Town of Mena, Ark.

Section 1. That any person who shall in the corporate limits of the town of Mena sell or give away any spiritous, vinous or malt liquors to any Indian, or shall sell or give away any spiritous, vinous or malt liquors to any minor without the written consent of his parents or guardian, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and on conviction thereof shall be fined in any sum not less than five nor more than twenty-five dollars.

Section 2. That any person who shall in the corporate limits of the town of Mena sell or give away any spiritous or malt liquors to any town prisoners while in the custody of any officer of the town, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and on conviction thereof shall be fined in any sum not exceeding Twenty-five dollars.

Section 3. That This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
