

Section 3. Any person violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be fined in any sum not more than ten dollars for each offense.

Section 4. This ordinance shall be in force and take effect from and after its passage and publication.

Health Officer-Duties of.

Be it ordained by the Town Council of the Incorporated Town of Mena Arkansas:

Section 1. That the Town Council of the incorporated town of Mena, Arkansas, shall elect a resident of the town of Mena to serve as Health Officer for and during the pleasure of the Council.

Section 2. That it shall be the duty of the Health Officer to make weekly inspections of all water closets privies, chicken houses, hog pens, pig styes and out houses of all kinds and character; also lots, livery stables and yards within the town, between the 1st day of May and the 1st day of November to the 1st day of any of the above named property or premises in an unsanitary or unhealthful condition, it shall be his duty to report the same to the President of The Board of Health.

Section 3. That the health Officer shall receive as compensation for his services the sum of one dollar per day for the days while he is actually engaged in the discharge of his duties.

Section 4. This ordinance shall be in force and take effect from and after its passage and publication.

Clandestine Sale of Intoxicating Liquors.

Be it ordained by the Town Council of The Incorporated Town of Mena, Arkansas:

Section 1. Any person owning or using or having control of any house or tenement of any kind, who shall sell or give away or shall cause or allow to be sold or given away any alcohol, ardent or vinous spirits or malt liquors, or any compound or tincture commonly called bitters or tonic, whether the same be sold or given away openly or secretly, by such device as is known as the "Blind Tiger," or by any other name or device shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor.

Section 2. If any person shall obtain any such alcohol, ardent or vinous spirits or malt liquors, or any compound or tincture commonly called bitters, in any house, room or tenement, owned, occupied or controlled through or into any room, place or tenement controlled by another by going therein or thereto, and by call, sound, word, or token, it shall be prima facie evidence of the guilt of the person who so owns, occupies or controls such house room or tenement, or if any persons are allowed to pass through or into any room or place so owned or controlled or occupied by another and there obtain such
