Ordinance No. 105.

Board of Health ✓

Be it ordained by the Town Council of the Incorporated Town of Mena Arkansas:

Section 1. That a Board of Health be appointed by the Town Council, composed of two Aldermen and one practicing physician, a resident of the incorporation. It shall be their duty to prevent the introduction and spread of infectious and contagious diseases, for which purpose they may use all lawful means. They shall have power, whenever in their opinion it becomes necessary, to establish hospitals for those infected with contagious diseases, and may employ a physician to attend thereto. They shall bring to the notice of the Town Council all matters having a tendency to prejudice the health of the town, and shall be allowed for any expenses incurred by any order of the Council

Section 2. The Board of Health shall have the power to pass any quarantine regulations it may deem necessary, in case of any contagious or infectious disease in the city, and any person or persons violating any such regulation or action of said Board of Health shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and ~~on conviction thereof~~ ~~thereof~~ shall be fined in any sum not less than ten dollars nor more than fifty dollars for each offense, and each day any person or persons so violating the action of the Board of Health shall be deemed a separate offense.

Section 3. That all laws and ordinances or parts of laws and ordinances in conflict with this ordinance be and the same are hereby repealed.

Section 4. This ordinance shall be in force and take effect from and after its passage and publication.

Vagrancy.

Be it Ordained by the Town Council of the Incorporated Town of Mena Arkansas:

Section 1. That every able-bodied person who shall be found loitering or rambling about in the town of Mena, Arkansas, not having any visible means of maintaining himself, and who doth not betake himself to labor or some honest calling to procure a livelihood; and all able-bodied persons who are found begging or who quit their home or leave their wives and children without means of subsistence, shall be deemed and treated as vagrants and on conviction thereof shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and fined in any sum not exceeding twenty-five dollars.

Section 2. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
