

Ordinance No. 33 ✓

False Pretenses and Frauds

Be it ordained by the Town Council of the Incorporated town of Mena, Arkansas.

Section 1. Every person who with intent to defraud or cheat another, shall designesly, by color of any false token or writing, or by any other false pretense, obtain a signature of any person to any writing or obtain from any person any money, personal property, right in action or other valuable thing or effects whatever within the town of Mena, Arkansas, shall upon ~~conviction~~ conviction thereof when the amount is ten dollars or less be deemed guilty of petty larceny and punished accordingly.

Section 2. If any false token by which any money, signature, property, right in action or other valuable thing shall be obtained as specified in the prededing Section, be a promissory note, bill of exchange, check of evidence of debt, purporting to have been made or issued by, or under the authority of, any banking company not in existence, if the amount thereof is ten dollars or less the person convicted of such offense shall be punished as in case of petty larceny.

Section 3. This ordinance shall be in force and take effect from and after its passage and publication.

Ordinance No. 34 ✓

Food-Offenses Against Purity of-Unwholesome Meat, Fish, Etc.

Be it Ordained by the town council of the Incorporated Town of Mena Arkansas.

Section 1. Whoever shall knowingly sell, or offer or expose for sale within the corporate limits of the town of Mena, Arkansas, or bring or cause to be brought into this town to sell or offer for sale or shall have in his or their possession with intent to sell for food the flesh of any animal dying otherwise than slaughter or any flesh as of one animal, knowing it to be of another species, or shall offer for sale or sell any tainted, diseased, corrupted, decayed or unwholesome meat, fish, fowls, vegetables, produce or provisions of any kind whatever in said town of Mena without making the same fully known to the purchaser or shall sell or offer for sale the meat of any calf which was killed before it had attained the age of six weeks, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof be punished by a fine not exceeding twenty-five dollars.

Section 2. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
