

Ordinance No. 68.

Relating to Appeal Bonds

Be it Ordained by the town Council of the Incorporated Town of ,
Mena Arkansas:

Section 1. That in no case taken by appeal from the Mayor's court of the town of Mena to the Circuit Court of the County of Polk by the defendant therein shall the attorney for the defendant ~~therein~~ shall be permitted to become surety on his client's bond. And no appeal shall be accepted or approved by the Mayor until the surety or sureties shall make and append thereto an affidavit that he or they own property in Polk county subject to execution and of the value of one hundred dollars over and above the amount exempted by the laws of the State from Execution.

Section 2. This ordinance shall be in force and take effect from and after its passage and publication.

Ordinance No. 69. ✓

Obstructing Sidewalks, Streets and Alleys, and Repairing Same.

Be it Ordained by the Town Council of the Incorporated Town of Mena, Arkansas.

Section 1. That all merchandise and packages containing merchandise, bales of hay, or any articles received by merchants or other persons remaining on any street or sidewalk in the town of Mena, more than one day after being received, are hereby declared to be a nuisance. Also all wagons, carriages or other vehicles of any description if the owner or agent of any such property shall fail to remove the same within the time prescribed, the Marshal shall notify such owner or owners or agents to remove them and if they fail to do so, the Marshal shall remove such obstacles.

Section 2. All Timber, logs, wood, empty boxes or any thing that is an obstruction, if left on any street, alley or sidewalk, is hereby declared a nuisance, if allowed to remain over twenty-four hours, and all owners of such property or their agents shall be ~~liable~~ liable to the penalties herein after prescribed, and the Marshal shall remove such obstacles.

Section 3. Any person failing to comply with the provisions of either of the foregoing Sections of this ordinance shall pay the expense of all removals or abatement of nuisances made by the Marshal, and on conviction shall pay a fine of not more than twenty-five dollars for such offense and fifteen dollars for each day the same may be continued.

Section 4. All streets laid down in the map or plat of the town of Mena shall be kept open and free from obstruction, and shall be kept in repair so as to be safe for all animals and vehicles to travel.

Section 5. Sidewalks or pavements shall be exclusive use of pedestrians and no obstruction of any kind shall be allowed thereon.

Section 6. No person shall ride, drive, propel or lead any animal, wheelbarrow, bicycle or vehicle upon any of the sidewalks, or tie any horse or other animal where it is likely to stand upon
